# Did you know?

Your child can get multiple vaccines with their COVID-19 vaccination starting at 6 months old.<sup>1</sup>

The CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get a COVID-19 vaccine and boosters are recommended for everyone 5 years and older to help protect them, if eligible. Your child may get a COVID-19 vaccine and other routine vaccines, including flu vaccine, at the same time.<sup>1,2</sup>

**Talk to your child's doctor about also getting other routine vaccinations today.**
